

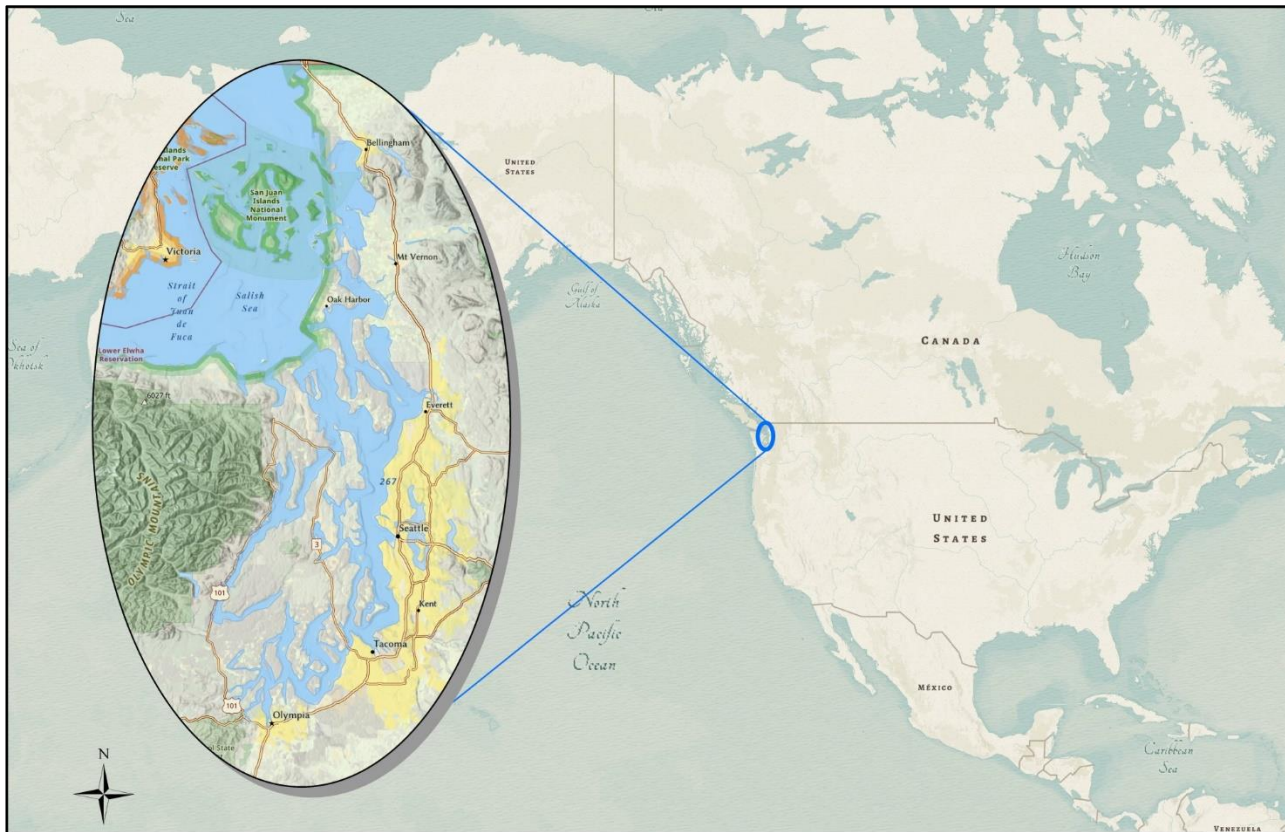

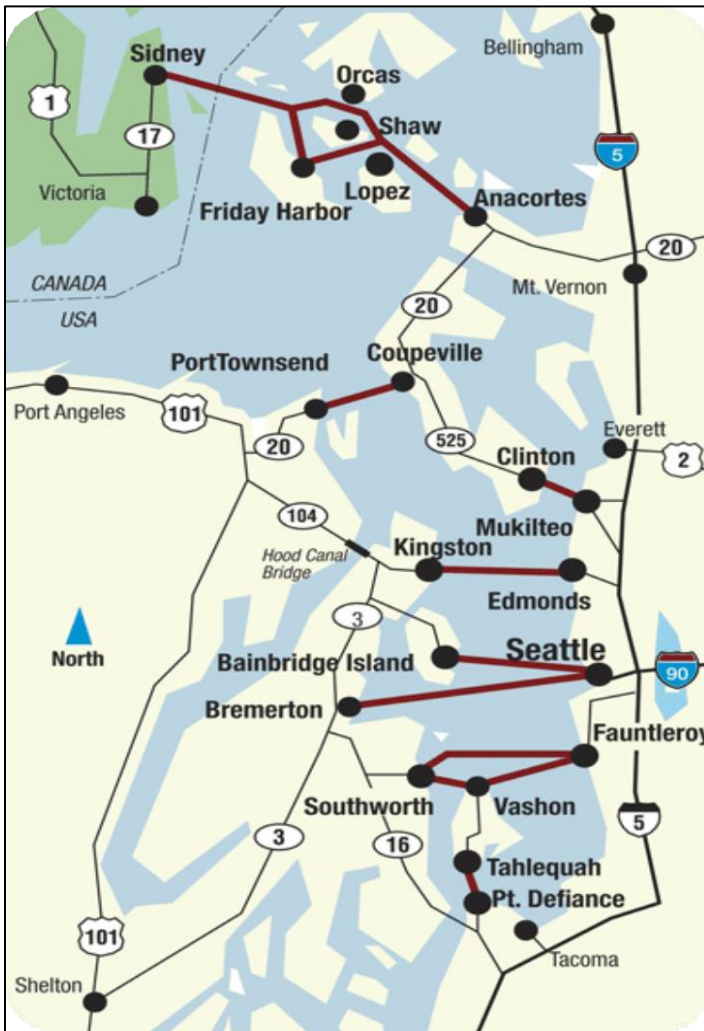
The Salish Sea



WSF Overview

The largest ferry system in the U.S.

- 21 auto-passenger ferries
- 10 routes serving 20 terminals
- 23.9 million riders in 2019
- 10.5 million vehicles in 2019
 - 450 sailings per day
 - 1,800 employees
- Largest state-owned shipyard in the U.S.

Zero-Carbon Fleet, 2020

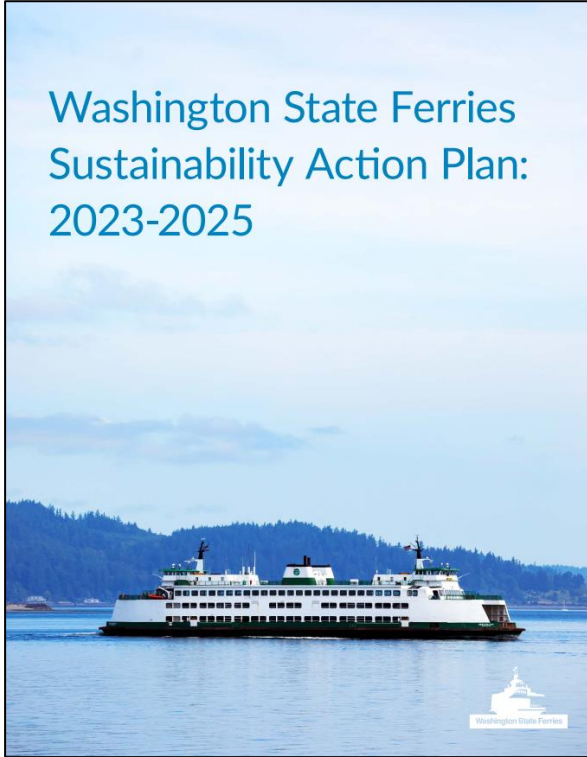


Quieter Ferries, 2018



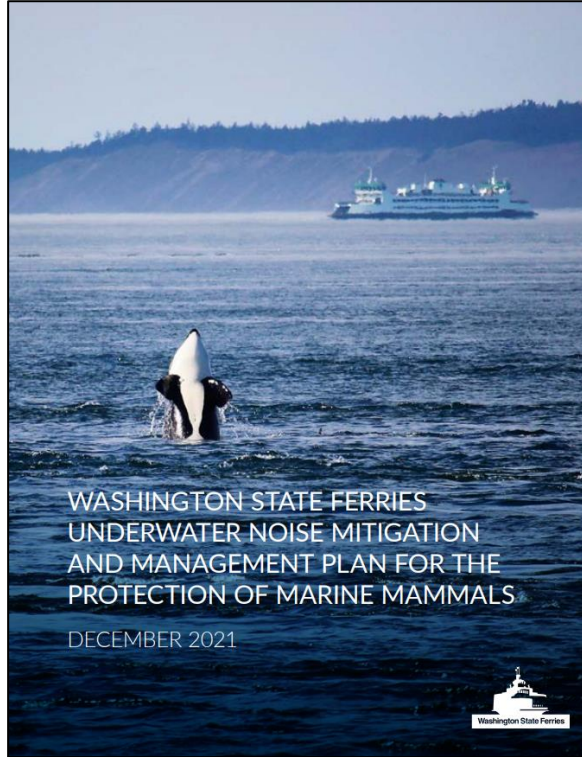
